THE PIECE HALL TRUST'S VISION

Opened in 1779 for the trading of "pieces" of woollen fabric produced on handlooms as part of Yorkshire's cottage industry, The Piece Hall is the only remaining Georgian cloth hall in the world.

This unique building is now under the care of registered charity The Piece Hall Trust which exists to project the past of this iconic heritage site while preserving it for future generations. Its mission is to sustain the venue as a free to enter world class destination attracting local, national and international visitors while ensuring The Piece Hall continues to be the major catalyst for the ongoing regeneration of Calderdale.

Its key pillars of heritage, trade, culture and community are brought to life via an inclusive schools and adult education programme; a premium retail offer of high-end boutique stores, café's and bars; industry leading pop and rock concerts; and a diverse range of community celebrations.

The Trust supports the preservation and promotion of this precious building's unique history while making sure it's always moving forward as a vibrant, relevant and contemporary 'must-see' visitor attraction.



A YEAR OF FIRSTS & BIG WINS

The financial year 2022-23 was a year of firsts for The Piece Hall. It saw the fifth anniversary of the venue's re-opening and marked a time of both reflecting on just how far it has come in such a short space of time, alongside a laser focus on the future, and where this unique and precious asset is heading.

The aim in this year was to build upon previous successes, with an enhanced, extended and more inclusive programme. This bigger and bolder offer saw the venue hosting its first Pride celebration, a House Weekender, the first Piece Hall Mela and the start of the groundbreaking relationship with promoters Cuffe & Taylor (part of the Live Nation family) which saw a lineup of global superstars grace the stage in its iconic courtyard as part of Live at The Piece Hall 2022.

Summer 2022 saw 12 nights of world class music covering a range of musical genres including Duran Duran, Paloma Faith, Noel Gallagher's High Flying Birds, Sir Tom Jones, Paul Weller plus Nile Rodgers & CHIC, all accompanied by BSL interpreters. The start of this five-year partnership with Cuffe & Taylor was a huge moment for The Piece Hall and will ensure it can continue to bring global artists to perform in the venue, benefiting The Trust itself, music fans, but also hospitality and retail businesses who will be positively impacted by increased footfall.



The 2022 season broke records for both the number of events and attendees and delivered a multi-million-pound boost for the local economy. Around 60,000 people attended the shows, many thousands visiting from outside Yorkshire with 80% of them going to restaurants & bars in the vicinity – benefitting local businesses.

As well as its musical offer, people continued to flock through the historic gates of The Piece Hall to eat, drink, shop; marvel at its unique heritage, experience culture or immerse themselves in community events. A landmark 10 million visitors was reached in the first half of the year with the total number since reopening surpassing 12 million by the end of the financial period concerned. These figures were boosted by a number of high-profile events including a triumphant four-day celebration to mark the late Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth's Platinum Jubilee. 55,000 people came to the courtyard to witness civic celebrations, attend a day to honour the emergency services, attend a "Concert for The Queen" and a join in with a community tea party.

Activities for families were plentiful with the courtyard hosting a beach and a roller rink in the summer and a skating rink at Christmas, and there were multiple arts and craft workshops throughout the year, both free and paid for, but often heavily subsidised.

The autumn of 2022 saw The Piece Hall launch its own brand of gin. Created in partnership with local craft artisan-distiller Speight's it was blended by taking inspiration from the fascinating heritage of the Grade I-listed building using botanicals from the surrounding Yorkshire landscape. The gin has since achieved a 'Bronze Award' in the London Spirits Competition'.



As The Piece Hall's profile continued to grow, so did its reputation. There were accolades aplenty with the building being recognised for its impact on tourism and also as an exemplar of place-making. It won several prestigious awards including the Yorkshire Post Outstanding Contribution to Tourism Award, The Academy of Urbanism 'Great Place' award and Business for Calderdale's "Promotion of Calderdale" award.

At the end of this financial period The Piece Hall relaunched its newly rebranded and repackaged membership scheme 'Club 1779.' With an improved offer including access to gig ticket presales, special discounts and exclusive member events through the year, this proved to be a big hit with many loyal fans of the building and its stellar programme.

The Piece Hall also revamped its donation system. At the time of writing, this precious heritage site costs around £13,000 per day to run, and new, different or improved ways of funding its survival are vital to ensure the future of this much-loved asset of global significance. This year saw The Piece Hall cement its position as a centre for trade, heritage, culture and community in the heart of Calderdale, with a unique offer designed for today's audiences, retailers and artists, with regional, national and international appeal.

CHAIR'S STATEMENT

SIR ROGER MARSH OBE DL



2022/23 is my sixth year as Chairman of The Piece Hall Trust board and the sixth year of operation after our transformation. I could not be prouder of what the incredible team, led by CEO, Nicky Chance-Thompson MBE DL, has achieved in that time and specifically what was achieved in the last financial year.

We continue to build on the four pillars of our strategy: heritage, culture, community, and trade.

The Piece Hall has firmly established itself as one of the best live performance venues in the country, thanks to our ongoing partnership with Cuffe & Taylor, part of Live Nation. We look forward to growing our reputation in the coming years.

Despite challenging economic conditions, we have remained free to enter. As well as hosting 12 huge summer gigs, around 30 Christmas shows in the Spiegeltent, numerous free community events, arts, crafts and family workshops, we gave nearly 2,000 guided heritage tours and welcomed more than 1,400 school pupils further boosting the local economy and giving back to our local community. This provides an important illustration of what being a charitable trust means in practice. A purely commercial entity would not provide the array of free activities and resources that we do. Growing our income means we can give something back to communities. This will remain an important ethos to us.

The board's continued aim is that we are commercially astute and culturally creative. This means that we are in favour of taking calculated risks and trying new ventures to delight and surprise our guests - some of which will be a great success, others, perhaps less so. Complacency is the enemy of growth and continued success. We never want to become complacent.

While The Piece Hall's transformation was not about generating significant operating surpluses but acting as the catalyst for the regeneration of Halifax, the board and executive team have sought to put The Piece Hall Trust into a small cash-positive position. This will allow us to build up a small contingency reserve to smooth out and mitigate future shocks and headwinds.

This financial year The Piece Hall Trust made a small financial surplus of just over £56,000 with income from Piece Hall Enterprises - our commercial trading arm which runs a number of outlets within the building - rising significantly (127%) from £1.5m to £3.5m. We were also successful in a number of important grant applications which saw our income from charitable activities rise from £1.4m in 2021/22 to £1.7m in 2022/23.

Costs also rose from £4.8m last financial year to £6.7m in 2022/23. This was largely due to the doubling of costs for putting on events, electricity prices rising by 145% vear on year, and direct staff costs also increasing.

We continue to significantly deliver on our regeneration impact for Halifax adding more than £7 to the local economy for every £1 spent. This is very visible when speaking to local businesses such as Holdsworth House who cite The Piece Hall as the major driver of their significant uptick in bookings.

As The Piece Hall evolves, so our board evolves. We actively consider succession planning as some members reach the end of their terms of appointment. This year I was pleased to welcome Jacgeline Palmer to the board. Jacqeline brings more than 20 years of experience in human resources, employee engagement and talent management from both the private and public sector. She is a strong addition to our team, and I welcome her to the board.

Our Chief Executive, Nicky Chance-Thompson DL, was commended by the Northern Power Women for levelling up leadership and by the Business Desk as their Northern Transformational Leader, and though outside this financial year. I must mention, more recently has been the much-deserved recipient of a King's Birthday Honour - being made a Member of the British Empire (MBE).

Thank you to Nicky and the team for all their hard work during this reporting period, which has made 2022/23 the best year yet in The Piece Hall's 250-year history.

CHIEF EXECUTIVE'S STATEMENT

NICKY CHANCE-THOMPSON MBE DL



The 2022/23 financial year has been a series of firsts for The Piece Hall Trust.

Our Live at The Piece Hall series set a record for the number of major gigs we hosted - including Nile Rogers & CHIC, Noel Gallagher's High Flying Birds, Sir Tom Jones and Duran Duran.

We hosted our first pride event, our first mela and our first iftar. We also gave thanks to our blue light workers with our first Emergency Services Day, and we joined the rest of the country in celebrating the late Her Majesty The Queen's unprecedented Platinum Jubilee.

We also broke through the 12 million visitor threshold with 2.5 million people coming through our gates during the year, spending money in The Piece Hall itself and more broadly around Calderdale in shops, restaurants and hotels, boosting the local economy significantly.

It is important to remember that when we scheduled in our events for the 2022/23 year - and at the start of this financial year - the Omicron COVID variant had recently been reported and there were some reports about a potential further lockdown. We were unsure of the appetite for attending large, in person events, and unsure of what the UK response would be to other emerging COVID variants. The war in Ukraine and general economic turbulence, added to inflation and the subsequent cost of living crisis pressures on businesses and households alike.

The purpose of regenerating The Piece Hall was for it to become the catalyst for the wider regeneration of Halifax, Calderdale and the North of England. Updated economic analysis by former government economists show that we have generated £7 for every £1 spent transforming and funding The Piece Hall which is 'exceptional' in HM Treasury terms. Given the quantity, quality, and range of the events we produced during the year we understandably had to scale up our team while also using more agency and security staff. Our operational and events teams are developing their expertise to enable us to deliver new, and high-profile world class events.

Now we have firmly established ourselves as a credible, alternative live music venue, our important relationship with our copromoter, Cuffe & Taylor, part of Live Nation, will also evolve.

The Piece Hall won several prestigious awards during the year including the Yorkshire Post Outstanding Contribution to Tourism Award, The Academy of Urbanism 'Great Place' and Business for Calderdale's "Promotion of Calderdale" award.

I want to pay thanks to Calderdale Council, the National Lottery Heritage Fund, Garfield Weston Foundation, The West Yorkshire Combined Authority, and the Department for Culture, Media and Sport for their ongoing financial support of our unique and transformative asset.



One of the strongest votes of confidence in the work we are doing is the number of repeat visits we see - whether from shoppers, attendance at our live events or by the major global acts who want to pay us a return visit. It's clear, that one visit to this unique venue is not enough.

COMMUNITY, HERITAGE & LEARNING

This year saw The Piece Hall's Heritage and Community Engagement team deliver a more diverse programme of events, projects, school workshops and community initiatives than ever before.

They were supported by their biggest ever group of dedicated volunteers, after training saw numbers rise to almost 100. The volunteers enabled and enriched the wide-ranging offer from family activities and Christmas gigs in the Spiegeltent to supporting the beach, Glice Rink, heritage tours and ensuring a great visitor experience in The Piece Hall Story exhibition and art gallery. They gave over 4,000 hours of their time with 213 hours devoted purely to heritage tours.



1,908 people attended a heritage tour - an increase of more than 100% on the previous year. This included tours for coach parties, heritage open days, Anne Lister tours, National Lottery Heritage Week, and our very own regular bookable weekly tours. The Heritage and Engagement Team continued to work closely with partners across the borough to support initiatives and the strategic development of creativity, culture and youth engagement as part of the CalderdaleCreates network and the Local Cultural Education Partnership.

1,443 school pupils were booked on school sessions, an increase of more than 50% on the year before and 52 classes took part in interactive tours and workshops, from 'Medieval to Modern Merchant' to 'We're Going on a Cloth Hunt'!

Outside the school's programme summer saw the courtyard come alive with family activity, with artist-led workshops ranging from sculpture to textiles and illustration to recycled crafts. Yorkshire Day's Piece Hall Game Show was an interactive family success, celebrating The Piece Hall's 5th birthdav.

The team facilitated a once in a lifetime celebration for the Platinum Jubilee of the late Her Majesty The Queen. Four consecutive days of events included more than 20 musical performances, civic celebrations, an emergency services day and a host of creative family activity. A highlight was

the unveiling of a commemorative plaque designed by 10-year-old Riley Yelland from Old Earth Primary School in Elland, chosen from hundreds of drawings by Calderdale children. The plaque was unveiled by the Lord Lieutenant of West Yorkshire and is now in position by The Piece Hall's West Gate.



The start of this financial year saw the end of the stunning Sophie Ryder exhibition. 617.045 people saw the impressive sculptures in the courtyard and more than 15,000 visitors went to the gallery exhibition. Media coverage saw an estimated 737K views as the works featured in The Times, The Yorkshire Post and BBC Look North amongst others. Family activities and adult learning running alongside the exhibition helped bring the show to life, with workshops including sculptural casting in jesmonite with young people and clay modelling with adults from the St Augustine's Centre (asylum and refugee support) art group.

The Piece Hall did more than ever to reach out to local communities and encourage people into the building. Working with verd de gris arts. CMBC and a host of local partners July saw another first as the venue hosted the launch of Calderdale's South Asian Heritage Festival, bringing musicians, businesses and food providers from across Calderdale together. Feedback was fantastic, and included "please, please do this again"; "we have lived here all our lives and have never had this in the centre of Halifax"; "we felt seen and celebrated" and "loved every minute of it".

The Piece Hall's first ever Mela saw more than 17,000 people experience the sights, sounds and tastes of South Asia. This new partnership with the acclaimed Birmingham and Sandwell Mela brought musical performances from high profile artists Maz Bonafide, DJ Manny and Chand Ali Khan Qawwal & Party.

A stunning Iftar Under the Stars event was hosted with the 51st Pellon Scouts. Hundreds of families came to break their fast during Ramadan, celebrate together in the moonlight and take part in games, prayer, crafts and song. This year also saw the venue's second Eid event. Connecting with local partners Healthy Minds, the Halifax Community Fridge and the 51st Pellon Scouts, the event marked Eid-al-Fitr and included music, arts and crafts, henna, face painting and delicious local food.



November saw a beautiful Diwali celebration involving dance, music and performance, with a sensitive programme curated by Annapurna Indian Dance.

The team were incredibly busy over the Christmas season offering a wide programme of free drop-in craft activities. Children were inspired to draw with professional illustrator Chris Mould while adults got creative making stained glass decorations and textile wreaths with many more workshops on offer.

Giving something back is key. This was highlighted by collecting donations of Christmas presents, on behalf of Calderdale Lighthouse, for children and young people in Calderdale who would otherwise go without a gift and then wrapping hundreds of presents at the huge Calderdale Lighthouse Wrap event in the Spiegeltent.

Over 700 children took part in the spooky Halloween Trick or Treat Trail, sponsored by The Piece Hall's very own Al's Emporium. The Piece Hall was the hub and welcome point for the Anne Lister Birthday Week festival in April which attracted visitors from across the world. The team delivered special tours and events, including a moving flower laying ceremony at the Anne Lister sculpture. This has become an important part of the annual commemorations of Anne's legacy and is a significant event for LGBTQI+ communities both locally and globally.

A different exhibition facilitated by the Heritage and Learning team saw a celebration of hairstyles and hairdressing through the ages. Beehives, Bobs and Blowdries was a multi-media exhibition, in the Caygill Room, by hair stylist Andrew Barton and academic Donna Bevan. It showcased photographs, wigs and fashion charting the history of hair design and culture from the 1950s to present day. This was The Piece Hall's first exhibition of fashion and design, and welcomed more than 3000 visitors in a month, including college and university students.





SOCIAL MEDIA PRESENCE **& PRESS COVERAGE**

MEDIA PRESENCE

The largest audiences hearing about The Piece Hall from the press during this period were at Mail Online. MSN Web and BBC Online. Coverage was down only fractionally from the previous period which received a major boost after the courtyard was used a location for the global TV show Marvel's Secret Invasion.

Coverage was achieved in key regionals Manchester Evening News and Evening Standard. Much of this was due to the impressive and newsworthy Live at The Piece Hall lineup and also the Christmas markets.

National coverage was featured in The Daily Express and Daily Telegraph linked to the conclusion of the hugely popular Calderdale based BBC TV show Happy Valley and the rise of The Piece Hall's ongoing successful regeneration and continued rise a tourist destination. It was enhanced further by the announcement of The Piece Hall as an official site for the screening of The Coronation of King Charles III and included ITV.com, The Times online and Sky News.

The Piece Hall featured extensively on BBC Breakfast in December 2022 with interviews from CEO Nicky Chance-Thompson MBE DL and some Piece Hall Traders which was seen by 1.5 million viewers.

Nicky was also interviewed by BBC Radio Leeds on a number of occasions, which included the finale of their Children in Need activity which concluded at The Piece Hall.

SOCIAL MEDIA

In the past year, our social media channels have experienced continued growth. Our following across Facebook, Instagram, and Twitter grew from 96,000 to 107,000, reflecting a significant 11.46% increase.

Not only did followers grow, but through consistently producing and sharing engaging and effective content, we reached 15 million users on Facebook alone, and received an impressive 10.14% average engagement rate across all platforms, surpassing the industry standard which considers an engagement rate above 5% 'very high'.

This demonstrates that we're continuing to build a loyal, engaged community, and expanding our reach and catching new people's attention.



I never in my wildest dreams, well maybe the wildest, thought that one day I would be running a successful business from this magnificent space in the heart of Halifax. The Piece Hall is a majestic, thought provoking, serene, a world class music venue, a historical landmark and a haven for independent businesses just like mine.

I launched Hudson Belle in the Winter of 2018, while still working as a lead nurse in the NHS. Leaving full- time employment with a secure pension for self-employment and the unknown was by far the riskiest venture I have ever undertaken. Those first years were incredibly daunting, having only my life experience and my love for gifts, Sid Dickens and all things interiors to guide me. We survived Covid, with the unwavering support of our loyal customer base and The Piece Hall team and came out the other side stronger than ever. We expanded our offer of gifts, added interior pieces, soft furnishings and accessories with our Sid Dickens collection taking pride of place.

Hudson Belle is a family run affair that has grown from a wild idea into a wellestablished small business with wonderful customers from all over the country and the locality. I love what we do and I wouldn't swap it for anything. After 25 years, I de registered as a nurse with confidence in the future of my business and have never looked back. The Piece Hall is a gem, the team and the tenants work extremely hard to keep it thriving and working for the locality and the future of Halifax. I am very proud and privileged to have my business located in the jewel in the crown of Halifax with the best view out of my shop window, I can honestly say it's the best risk I have ever taken and I love it!

OUR IMPACT TOLD BY OTHERS

Another incredible year for The Piece Hall! It has been the talk of the town - and beyond with its biggest events and live music season yet. This has strengthened Calderdale's national and international profile as the place to be for culture, heritage and music - reaffirming the major role that this unique destination plays in the identity and economy of both Calderdale and West Yorkshire. Since reopening in 2017, The Piece Hall has added nearly £10.2 million to the local economy on average each year. Living proof that culture drives regeneration. Calderdale's Year of Culture in 2024 is set to be the borough's biggest cultural celebration ever, throughout all our communities. With 2.4 million visitors annually, The Piece Hall's role in this will be crucial. So will its ongoing contribution to the Council's priority for thriving towns and places through its positive impact on local businesses, whilst reducing inequalities by remaining a free-to-enter venue that people can enjoy despite the cost of living.

The Piece Hall has done so much for local people's pride, wellbeing and togetherness. Seeing some of the biggest names in music on their doorstep, with 120,000 tickets sold, has brought joy to many and an appetite to explore other aspects of local culture. This is a welcoming venue for everyone – it turns seamlessly from a temporary beach into a skating rink and has showcased Calderdale's tradition of diversity and inclusion by bringing people together for religious festivals and other celebrations.

2022/23 was a great year for cultural events at The Piece Hall. From focused local engagement such as school visits and craft workshops, to larger scale events such as Nowruz and the Eid-ul-Fitr celebration, our team was busy in its endeavour to education and entertain.

We forged many new relationships with local businesses and charities and worked together with our amazing volunteers to highlight the important cultural heritage of our building and the wider Calderdale community. We achieved international recognition with events such as the South Asian Heritage Festival, which was launched at The Piece Hall, being covered on news sites in Pakistan. The result of these events has been an increased engagement from Muslim, refugee, and ethnic minority communities at The Piece Hall and the ability to develop a more diverse and culturally aware programme that provides for the multicultural population living in Calderdale. We have been honoured to work with refugee communities living in Halifax and to establish focus groups that engage with people from different backgrounds which will help us to develop our offer further. THE NEXT CHAPTER

Since the end of the financial year covered in this review, The Piece Hall has gone from strength to strength, growing in reputation and receiving wider recognition, both nationally and internationally.

The huge success of the summer 2022 shows saw an even bolder plan emerge for 2023 with major artists being announced to huge critical acclaim from both fans and commentators.

More than 20 stellar 'Live at The Piece Hall' 2022 gigs, in partnership with Cuffe & Taylor, from artists as diverse as Limp Bizkit, boygenius, Queens Of The Stoneage and The Jacksons saw BBC Online pose the question: "[Is The Piece Hall] the best live music venue in the UK?"

The Piece Hall also staged a number of large scale shows independently, including its second Mela, Calderdale Pride, Ellie Sax & Friends, Our House and its first family festival - In The Yard.

Inflationary pressures, notably with energy and raw material costs, continue to pose significant challenges for the Trust. Those pressure are also keenly felt by tenants of The Piece Hall. The Trust offered increased marketing support to these small, independent businesses. The 2023 Christmas Markets were the venue's biggest and best to date enhanced by a triumphant first Christmas parade for the town co-ordinated by Halifax Bid, which concluded in The Piece Hall courtyard.

Other elements of the Christmas offer ran less smoothly with the great British weather bringing a number of challenges for the courtyard and its temporary structures during the festive period.

Improvements have been made to The Piece Hall's food and beverage offers which has seen growth in some areas and consolidation in others.

The Club 1779 membership scheme has proved to be phenomenally successful with numbers peaking above 8,000 for the first time.

The Piece Hall Trust has also welcomed a new agreement with Calderdale Council which sees them continue to invest in the area's most important asset, ensuring the venue can continue to build on the four pillars of heritage, culture, community, and trade – and remain free to enter for all who visit.


